	 Longwall A7 was completed on 19 April 2014. 		
	 Development mining continued in Stage 3. On Tuesday 15 April 2014 an incident occurred in the development mining area whereby two mine workers were fatally injured as a result of a rib collapse. An investigation by the Mine Safety Office of the NSW Department of Trade and Investment, Regional Infrastructure and Services (DTIRIS) to determine the cause of the incident is ongoing. Austar & Yancoal's thoughts are with the families and friends of our deceased co-workers at this difficult time. We are continuing to offer support to both families and to our employees and contractors. Longwall move to A8 is in progress. LWA8 is planned to commence mid June 2014. 		
	GM – Yancoal has set up a trust fund to enable employees and local businesses to donate to the victims of the Austar tragedy. Local businesses have been calling to see how they can assist.

	 Annual average PM₁₀ is well below Annual Average Maximum Criteria at both locations in 2014 Deposited dust gauge D5 (south of 3 Shaft) returned a high result of 5.2 g/m².month for March. The annual average result for D5 is currently above maximum criteria 4 g/m² because Jan-Feb 2014 results were contaminated, therefore were not usable. A visual investigation of surrounding area revealed no reason for increased dust level. D5 gauge result to be reviewed in future months. All other gauges deposited dust below maximum criteria. Graphs of air quality monitoring data were presented.
