	DM – that it is a possibility in the future for services. Also indicated that Austar moving the pit top to Kitchener Surface Infrastructure Site (SIS) is on hold. There is potential we may install a man rider at SIS or 4 shaft for emergency egress.

	 During a heavy rain storm event turbid runoff was observed flowing down CHPP main access road and towards Bellbird Creek 		
	 Immediately contained using bund to divert water back into dirty water system 		
	 System upgraded with installation of permanent diversion drains into the dirty water system 		
	30 June 2013 – Fine Tailings Spill at Borehole		
	 Borehole used for disposal of fine tailings to old underground workings. Borehole area is contained in bunded area. Borehole became blocked and bund filled with tailings. Tailings leaked from bund around a pipeline in the bund wall and onto ground in the clean water catchment. Regular routine inspections observed incident and tailings spill to land was cleaned up. 		
	MONITORING – SUBSIDENCE		
	 Monitoring survey undertaken in July 2013. Graphs of subsidence measurement presented. 		
	 Subsidence results are within predicted levels, currently at slightly less than 25mm in Stage 3 area. 		
	MONITORING – AIR QUALITY		
	 Annual average PM₁₀ is well below Annual Average Maximum Criteria at both locations. 		
	 Annual average insoluble solids (g/m².month) recorded from dust deposition gauges remains below Annual Maximum Criteria of 4 g/m² at all gauges except location D2 (Pelton Village). At D2 Jan-Apr 2013 data has all been greater than 4 g/m². Prevailing wind direction during these months has not supported Austar as the source. In May 2013 the gauge was stolen. Jun/Jul results were again below 4 g/m². 		
	 Results from new Stage 3 dust gauges D7-D9 presented. Results show very little dust.

	MONITORING – NOISE KITCHENER SIS		
	 One noise exceedance during May to July 2013 – 12 June 2013 during commissioning of new ventilation fans at Kitchener SIS Fans are designed and constructed with outlets pointed to the west (away from residents), silencers are fitted to the outlets, and temporary 3.5m barrier wall erected prior to commissioning Monitored noise levels at the nearest resident were LAeq 33 dB. Noise was classified as low frequency noise – which attracted a 5 dB modifying factor penalty meaning the assessable noise level is LAeq 38dB. With the modifying factor, this represents a 3dB exceedance of our Project Approval limits (LAeq 35dB). An issue was immediately identified with assembly of the fans which was rectified, with noise levels greatly reduced to less than limits.

	 No vibration events from 4 May to 18 June 2013 in Stage 2 Area. LWA5a finished in February 2013. No events since LW completed. 		
	 Vibration monitors moved to Stage 3 Area on 18 June 2013.

	 All events at V8, no triggers at V7 		
	All events <2.0mm/sec		
	 Note: all events were below the level where cosmetic structural damage may occur of 15mm/sec.

 received 18 complaints: 15 May 2013 – 16 odour complaints regarding compost spread at Aberdare Emplacement Area. Ripping of compost and seeding occurred during the week. Significant reduction in odour as a result. Review alternate organic materials for future rehabilitation activities. 21 May 2013 – Resident in Francis St, Bellbird raised issue of fine dust in pool generating from Aberdare Reject Emplacement Area. Austar met with resident to discuss rehabilitation activities. 5 June 2013 – Resident reported noise and vibration 		
impacts from 3 shaft fan area to EPA who notified Austar. Anonymous complaint. Austar advised EPA of operations at 3 shaft and result of recent monitoring.
