	The minutes of the previous meeting were considered representative of that meeting. AS moved, CM seconded.	
4	Business Arising from Previous Minutes	
	MMH advised Departmental approval of MG to the Committee.

	Correspondence was included in the agenda, no further discussion.	
6	Current Operations, Environmental Monitoring Update, Complaints	
	CM – gave update on operations and planned exploration activities (as detailed in the attached presentation).	
	PS – where is explorations planned for?	
	CM — exploration activities are planned for south of the Stage 3 mining area. Specific locations of drill holes have not been determined as no consultation with landholders has been undertaken yet.	
	PS – is there any planned changes to workforce numbers?	
	CM — returning operations to the Stage 3 area continues to be assessed. Mining will continue in LWB6 for the next quarter, with manning remaining at current levels during this time. If mining goes ahead in Stage 3, there will be considerable time taken to re-establish infrastructure before the commencement of development mining.	
	CM – outlined the noise exceedance on 11 June 2019 (detailed in presentation)	
	AB – noted the noise at her residence on this night was much louder than usual.	
	CM – explained the conditions were very still and noise carried very easily.	
7	General Business	

CM – outlined Austar's Bushfire Management Planning, including reviewing fuel loads, water supplies, monitoring roads and tracks around site for accessibility, and encouraged the CCC to review their Bushfire Management Plans.

PS – reiterated that this summer, bushfire management is going to be a very important issue due to current conditions.

MG - shared with the CCC that Brian and Justin from Austar Mine took some of the police officers from Cessnock Station on an underground mine tour last week, which was very interesting and a worthwhile visit to better understand the site and the operation and passed on his thanks to the mine for hosting the visit.

AB – noted that she had received feedback from residents close to Frances St that it has been very dusty due to the current operations at the Aberdare Emplacement Area.

CM – noted that we have been undertaking inspections of that area, especially on higher wind days, and that the water cart has been operational while trucks are running, and that we will continue to monitor while the rehabilitation activities are undertaken.








Underground Mining Operations

 Approval from Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) was granted on 7 August 2019 to shorten the lengths of LWB5 and LWB6 through revised panel finishing points and also to reduce both the length and width of







Underground Mining Operations

- Longwall mining in panel LWB5 was completed on 17 August 2019
- Currently moving longwall mining equipment to LWB6, with mining scheduled to commence in late September to early October 2019
- Mining of LWB6 planned for completion in February 2020
- Surface vibration events are being recorded in the current mining area
- There were two coal burst events during the extraction of LWB5. On both occasions, remote mining was being undertaken due to predicted elevated coal burst risk and personnel were well clear (>190m) from the events. There are nil predicted high coal burst potential areas identified in the LWB6 panel
- At this stage, the development and extraction of LWB7 is deferred to a later, not yet defined, date
- The Stage 3 area continues to be assessed by the company and nil decisions have been made at this point in time



Coal Handling and Preparation Plant (CHPP)


- CHPP operating and consistently washing coal since last meeting
- Plant maintenance activities being undertaken during the longwall move (August/September) with normal production resuming in October for remainder of the LWB6
- Predicted to increase to 3-4 trains/day in September until completion of LWB6
- Rehabilitation activities continuing at Aberdare Coarse Reject Emplacement Area

Environmental Incidents (29 May – 27 August 2019)

Noise Criteria Exceedance - CHPP

- Exceedance of noise limits at NMC1 (West CHPP) and NMC3 (North CHPP) during routine compliance monitoring on night of 11 June 2019
- Follow-up monitoring 13 June 2019 compliant with noise limits
- Contributing factors: idling locomotive and compressor noise in combination with conveyor and dozer track noise; weak inversion conditions potentially causing enhanced noise levels
- Reported to Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) and Environment Protection Authority (EPA)

On-going Clean Water Drainage Line Investigation – CHPP (6 June 2017)

- Continue to monitor surface and groundwater
- Any runoff contained and pumped to precipitate dam










Bellbird South Mining Area

- Maximum recorded surface level movement on Sandy Creek Road is approximately 540 mm with the last survey conducted on 13 August 2019


















Dust Deposition Gauge D1 - Insoluble Solids




Dust Deposition Gauge D2 - Insoluble Solids






Dust Deposition Gauge D3 - Insoluble Solids




Dust Deposition Gauge D4 - Insoluble Solids






Dust Deposition Gauge D5 - Insoluble Solids




Dust Deposition Gauge D5A - Insoluble Solids






Dust Deposition Gauge D7 - Insoluble Solids




Dust Deposition Gauge D8 - Insoluble Solids







Dust Deposition Gauge D9 - Insoluble Solids






































- Overall groundwater level has remained stable or is in minor decline attributable to current prolonged dry conditions, with the exception of MB03A
- MB03A levels increased slightly, likely due to rainfall in March and late April as seen on pressure transducer readings around this time
- No changes to existing trends in groundwater quality or water levels since previously reported






Stage 3 MB01 sandstone aquifer groundwater level hydrograph


- Noise criteria exceedance recorded on 11 June 2019


Vibration

Since last CCC meeting (29 May – 27 August 2019)

- Monitor V7 345 Quorrobolong Road
 - Monitoring commenced 11 June 2013
 - No new vibration events recorded greater than 1mm/s on any axis
- Monitor V11 above LWB6
 - Monitoring commenced 19 July 2017
 - 12 new vibration events recorded greater than 1mm/s on any axis
 - Ranging between 1.14-13.65 mm/s peak vibration
- Monitor V10 above LWB5
 - Monitoring commenced 28 August 2017
 - 14 new vibration events recorded greater than 1mm/s on any axis
 - Ranging between 1.17-5.73 mm/s peak vibration
 - Mining completed in LWB5 on 17 August 2019
- Minimal risk of cosmetic damage criteria 15 mm/s (BS 7385:1993)


